Apple Orchard Mountain trip on Saturday, May 20

That's Migratory Bird Day! — and by happenstance it's the day for our annual pilgrimage to this special place for seeing migrating wood warblers, vireos, Rosebreasted Grosbeaks, and Scarlet Tanagers. Dick Rowe, VMI biology professor and Club Ornithologist, will be our leader.


We'll meet at the Lexington Food Lion parking lot at 6:30 a.m. to caravan to the Parkway. Alternatively, you may travel on your own and meet the group at 7:30 a.m. at the Sunset Fields pull-off (mile marker 78.4).

From there, we'll follow Radar Road on foot to the top of Apple Orchard Mountain, a gradual up-and-back walk of about 2 miles — with frequent stops to look and listen — returning to Lexington mid-afternoon.

Get acquainted — or re-acquainted — with some warbler songs!

Here's the Bird Advisor's <u>webpage</u> presenting the songs of a dozen or so warblers, most of whom we have a chance of seeing on Apple Orchard Mountain. There are tips on what to listen for, and each warbler gets a photo portrait plus both audio and video of its song. (You might want to skip over the following species for now: Yellow & Prairie Warblers are found at lower elevations, and Dick tells us Yellow-rumps are barely possible up on the Ridge and Wilson's very rare.)
